The new Aviation Exhibition needs a number of volunteers to welcome visitors and act as wardens, giving at least three hours a week Weds- Sundays. An interest or knowledge of RAF Locking, Westlands, Bristol Aerojet or Western Airways history

would be useful but not essential.

After several years of planning and a £134,000 grant from the Coastal Communities Fund, a team of volunteers at The Helicopter Museum has restored the original 1930s Weston Airfield Control Tower complex adjacent to the museum and fitted it out with artefacts and displays covering the history of aviation in the area. The new exhibition will officially open in March.

"The Weston-super-Mare area has a rich vein of aviation history," says Museum Manager Lee Mills "with early flights from the beach before the First World War, airline operations from the new airport from the mid1930s and Bristol Aeroplane Co. shadow factories and RAF Locking being established in the early days of the Second World War."

The control tower is especially notable as having originally been a cab shelter on Weston seafront, relocated to the airfield when the Borough Council agreed to establish an airport on the outskirts of the town in 1935.

Post war saw a continuation of aircraft manufacturing, culminating in the establishment of helicopter design and production, as well as private and commercial light aeroplane operations until it all ended in 2002. Today the Helicopter Museum is the only operator still flying from the old airport.

Chairman of The Helicopter Museum Trustees, Elfan Ap Rees, says "When the idea of a museum to represent the history of the helicopter was first initiated in the late 1970s, we registered the name as "The British Rotorcraft Museum and Avon Air Collection Limited", with the idea in our minds of eventually covering the wider local aviation scene. Its taken nearly 40 years to happen and we are very grateful to the volunteers and support from local companies that enabled us to complete the project at a fraction of the cost that would normally be budgeted by most museums. We now hope the new exhibition will remind visitors and new residents to the town, of the part Weston played in the West Country's aviation history."

At our meeting on October 3rd, Emma King the manager of the retail section of Weston Hospice, gave us an interesting insight into how the retail side of the organisation works. I think we were all surprised just how many Hospice Charity Shops we have in the Weston and Worle area. Emma explained how the shops were organised to ensure the maximum funds can be raised from the generous donations received.

On Wednesday 25th October, 26 of our ladies visited Rich's Cider Press Restaurant. The outing also included a tour, and as the weather was dry and bright, we were able to visit one of their cider orchards and hear how the orchards are managed, using the most environmentally friendly methods possible, including using sheep as lawn mowers and fertiliser distributors.

We saw the old machinery in the museum and heard how the process has developed over the years, but still producing the original cider we all love. We saw the journey of the apples from the orchard to the finished cider product, and everything is done on the farm, so very little food miles are involved. We saw the enormous Oak Vats and finished our tour with a welcoming tasting session before moving to the restaurant for a lovely lunch.



It was a wild, wet and windy evening for our November meeting, and it was lovely to see so many of our members turning up to support our speaker and I know they weren't disappointed. A lovely lady called Dilly came along to tell us all about 'Uncle Paul's Chilli Charity'.

The charity was the dream of Mark and his Uncle Paul, they wanted to provide a supportive environment where young people with complex needs or who have experienced social disadvantage, could develop self-belief and feel part of the community. They set up Uncle Paul's Chilli Charity in a forty acre farm of fields and woodlands near Blagdon reservoir. The young people can get involved and hands on with beekeeping, horses, pigs, lamas, ducks and chickens, learning skills and building friendships and

Dilly is responsible for making a selection of unique sauces, jams and preserves all made from chillies and produce from the farm. The production has really taken off and once again involves the youngsters who farm the produce and help in the production. We were able to sample the produce and purchase our favourites.






Fundraising News


Friendship Circle


