## 25th Anniversary visit to Dabaso

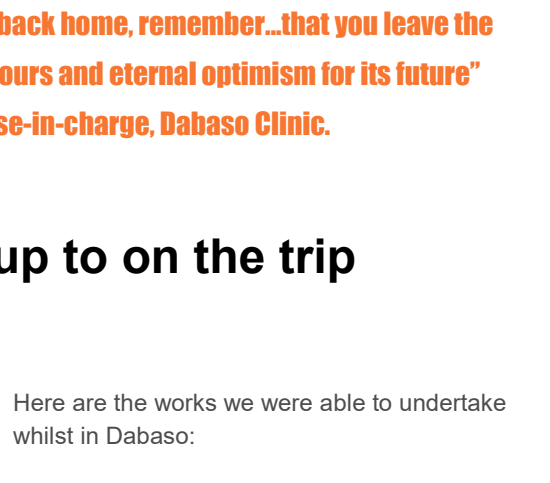
The visit was a great success and a highlight was of course the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

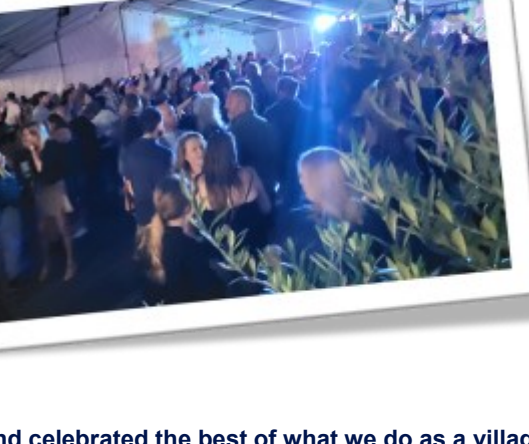
Dabaso football team in their new kit

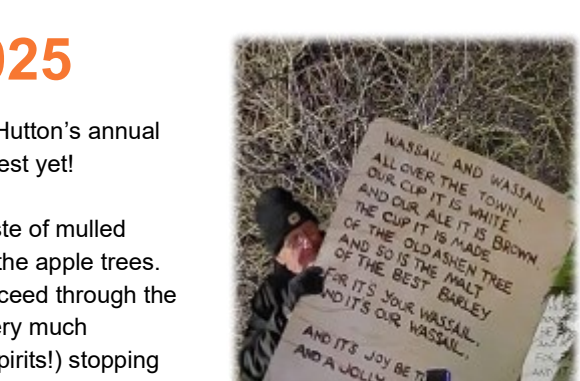


Dabaso football team in their new kit
