### Hutton Parish News Distribution Update

### <u>Hutton Wassailing</u>

On a chilly evening in January, it was wassailing time again, with the Hutton & Dabaso Twinning Association Committee holding its annual Dabaso fundraising event. A big thank you must go to all at the Hutton & Dabaso Twinning Association Committee, 15A Moorcroft Road, Walnut Barn and the Wassailing event volunteers for this extremely well organised and enjoyable traditional Hutton community event.

### Dog Poo on Pavements and Public Rights of Way and Related North Somerset Council Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs) and Dog Control

There has been a **notable increase** in the amount of **uncleared dog poo and unpicked up bags of dog poo** on our pavements and Public Rights of Ways, **especially in areas frequently used by children**, such as the Public Right of Way footpath from Elmhurst Road to the Main Road in Hutton, leading to the school and Elmhurst Park Play Area. Dog poo and unpicked up dog poo bags are also frequently seen in Moor Lane, **even just yards away from the waste bins, placed at both ends of Moor Lane for that that purpose!**  North Somerset Council are targeting the owners who do not clear up after their pets and North Somerset Council **Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs) have replaced dog control orders.** 

North Somerset Council Area Wide Public Space Protection Orders on the North Somerset Council website – please see the following link - <u>Area wide orders | North</u> <u>Somerset Council (n-somerset.gov.uk)</u> state the following:

"Everywhere in the open air in North Somerset, where the general public is allowed to be, is subject to a **public space protection order**. This includes places where the public have to pay to enter."

If you are in charge of a dog, the orders require, at minimum, that you must:

keep your dog(s) under close control at all times.

carry a poo bag.

bag it and bin it, please don't fling it.

keep your dog(s) out of all children's play areas.

not walk more than six dogs at a time.

Anyone who fails to comply, without reasonable excuse, is in breach of North

**Somerset Council PSPOs unless specific exemptions apply within the order.** It is a requirement for anyone breaching the order to give their name and address to an authorised officer."

North Somerset Council PSPO fines can be given to:

Anyone seen not picking up after their dogs.

Anyone seen not disposing of bagged dog waste correctly by taking it home or putting it in a bin.

Not having a receptacle to pick up after their dog (such as a bag).

Having dogs off a lead in areas covered by the current PSPO.

Walking their dog within a dog exclusion zone.

North Somerset Council is asking residents to **report locations of dog fouling** using the app **Pooper Snooper** - <u>https://poopersnooper.app/get-started</u>.

The reports residents provide through the app will inform North Somerset Council of the worst offending areas and add to the list of hotspot areas North Somerset Council already has.

These areas will then be targeted by the council's contractor Local Authority S upport, who could issue fines under the Public Space Protection Order (PSPO).

North Somerset Council and Hutton Parish Council want to help to change some people's behaviour and improve our local environment, helping North Somerset and in particular the Parish of Hutton to become a cleaner and greener place for everyone.



#### **Hutton Village Hall**

Last year at Easter we called for help from you, our community. People generously came forward with their skills and financial support.

Many people didn't know that we are a registered charity and receive no external funding

We were on the brink of financial ruin with an outstanding water bill of  $\pm 5500+$  The heating was turned off due to bills of over  $\pm 2000$  a month to heat the halls.

The late Trevor Savage and his friend Brett Sedgebeer gave their time to repair a mains water leak, plus Ann & Colin Sandford met the cost of those initial repairs. Parishioners and Hall users held and attended events and donations were generously given, allowing us to repair the car park tarmac

Tony Lay worked with our water supplier to make an appeal against the cost of lost water. This was successful and that bill was completely wiped out.

Since then there have been various challenges – a failed heating pump, leaks in the roof, broken toilets and the floor in the Main Hall failing. These issues alone have cost over  $\pounds7000$ .

Everywhere is now cleaner and volunteers have made a great start to improving things. For example one lady has repainted the dark, bottle green radiators and the Main Hall is looking so much better.

Financially, it's been a tough 9 months. We have paid all our bills and have sufficient funds to pay our fuel bills this season. We need to find ways to fund major improvements, perhaps for replacing our elderly flat roof or maybe getting Solar PV on our roof?

The challenge now is to make the hall fit to run for the future. To do that you can help by attending events and/or support the hall with your time.

What can you do? What needs doing? Setting up and putting away chairs and tables for events Help to run the bar Facilitating Wielding a paint brush Administration Maintaining our website or Facebook pages Fund raising Grant applications

To this end we are holding a volunteer Work Party Day at the hall day on Saturday 23 March 2024 from 9:30am Come along and have a chat about what you can do to help or stay a while and do a bit of painting or use a screwdriver, brush, mop or duster or even make the coffee if that's what you're good at!

If you stay, we are providing a simple ploughman's lunch to keep you going.



### **Hutton Primary School**




Children from all year groups at Hutton School get the chance to take part in outdoor leaning throughout the year. Come rain or shine the children will spend their time learning all about our grounds.

**District Councillors report** 

We are pleased to say that the 20 MPH scheme for Hutton should be installed in May this year. The delay is that we have been trying to get agreement for the scheme to be extended to include towards Weston, the dangerous section of highway by Grange Farm, and towards Banwell the junction of Canada Coombe, where horse riders need to cross the road for access to the Mendip bridle ways.

We have not given up on the eventual inclusion of these areas in a future extension of the scheme, but we needed to see at least some of the scheme introduced in Hutton. Hutton Parish Council has allocated funds towards arriving at an agreement with North Somerset highways as to what additional works are needed to include these two areas. It is very disappointing for us both, that to date, we have not been able to get any agreement with North Somerset Highways department to include what we still consider to be two of the most dangerous sections of Highways in the village.

The island depends on its volunteers to keep it going, and you can visit the island to see for yourself on organise trips, which of course are at the mercy of the weather and the tides. We're so lucky to have all this history just a boat trip away.




