The Annual Parish Meeting took place on Tuesday 26th April in the Village Hall. This meeting was an opportunity for Parish organisations and our North Somerset District and Hutton Parish Councillors to present their annual reports to parishioners.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting took place on Monday 9th May in the Village Hall. It is during this annual meeting that the appointment of the Parish Council Chair, Vice Chair, Officers and Representatives takes place. This meeting resulted in Cllr Peter Dutton being nominated and accepting the position of Chair and Cllr Amy Harris being nominated and accepting the position of Vice Chair. The Minutes of the Annual Parish Council Meeting have been produced by our Clerk to the Parish Council (Steve Cope) and are available, on the Parish Council web site. The Minutes not only detail the appointments of the Parish Council Chair, Vice Chair, they also detail all the associated Parish Council Officers and Representatives.

Elmhurst Play Area Refurbishment

Phase 1 of the Elmhurst Play Area refurbishment is now complete and our very grateful thanks go to the Parish Council Lead on this project - Cllr Ben Groom. Ben has worked on the project for over 18 months and has liaised and consulted with users, contractors and subsequently dealt with the dismantling, removal and disposal of the old equipment and the installation of the new play equipment. The Parish Council will now look to secure funding for Phase 2 of the refurbishment. Further detailed information and photographs can be found in this edition.

HM Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee - Celebrations

Many events were held in the Parish over the extended June Bank Holiday weekend to celebrate HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee. These included several street and garden parties, organised and held by parishioners and the following public events and activities:

New St Mary's Church Platinum Jubilee Entrance Gates. A dedication of the new Parish Council sponsored church entrance gates was held by Rev Anne Wilkins at St Mary's Church. These gates will serve as a reminder of the HM Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee in the decades to come. The original plaque from the old gates has been retained and refitted to the new gates for historical reference to the old gates to commemorate the Coronation of HM Queen Elizabeth II on the 2nd Jun 1953. Our very grateful thanks go to the makers of the new gates - David Hart and Daniel Leach of this Parish on behalf of the Parish Council for St Mary's Church.

"Plant a Tree for the Jubilee" - New Platinum Jubilee Tree in the Des Phippen Park. A new Parish Council sponsored oak tree was planted in the Des Phippen Park by Cllr Ben Groom and the 1st Locking & Hutton Scout Group. The tree was planted as part of the Queen's Green Canopy. This is an initiative that began in May 2021 in the UK in honour of the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II to increase and protect the native tree cover, with people being invited to create this 'special gift' for the Queen, to mark her 70 years on the throne. The planting of this new tree will benefit future generations to come and our very grateful thanks go to the 1st Locking & Hutton Scout Group for their support.

Event – A careful eye was kept on the weather by the organisers of the planned Sunday parade and due to the unsettled and potential bad and hazardous weather forecast for the Sunday afternoon, a decision was made the day before to cancel the planned parade and to move the event to the Village Hall. This resulted in a lot of urgent activity by the organisers to inform parishioners, parade participants, vintage car owners, the food and drink providers (Scouts and Toot Sweets), musicians, children's entertainers and then to get volunteers to set up and

decorate the Village Hall in preparation for the event.

Our very grateful thanks go to the food and drink providers (Scouts and Toot Sweets), children's entertainers, Eric Holdaway and the Band, Hutton Village Hall and all the volunteers who planned, set up, managed and then tidied up, what turned out to be, a very successful and extremely well attended event (with 300+ attendees). As a memento, all the attendees to the Village Hall event received a Parish Council funded Platinum Jubilee Medal.

Art Exhibition by Bleadon Art Group




An exhibition of art has been put up in the (small) hall in Hutton. It depicts the life of our Queen - more or less from her birth up to the present day, and celebrates her 70 years on the throne.

In February this year, Stevie Rhodes, who is a member of Bleadon Art Group, was asked by the Bleadon Hall

Management committee if it would be at all possible for the group to produce work that could "decorate" the hall as a tribute to her Majesty. Stevie created some wonderful banners showing the various stages of the Queen's life, and all the different eras that she has reigned through up to the present day. Members of the group, as well as their tutor - Michael Colgan - painted pictures and

portraits of Her Majesty at different times of her life, as well as the late Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh and other items of royal interest. Some of these works are outstanding. There are also collages and



a time-line. Stevie made a red wall-type posting box in which children could en-




ter the competition that she

vised - "Spot the Corgi"! Hidden amongst the pictures and collages on display are 83 corgis! The challenge was for the children to find the location and write it on the form and post it in the red post-box. The corgis are not all there now!!

The exhibition was put up in the Bleadon Jubilee Hall so visitors could see it over the Jubilee weekend. It seemed a great shame that, although there were many visitors over that week-end, this work could not be shared with other members of the public, particularly when so much effort had been employed to produce it. Nearly all the items on show in Bleadon were transported down the road to Hutton Village Hall, where they are being displayed. Everyone is welcome to go to visit the exhibition, but anyone wanting to see it should first check that the hall is not in use at the time when they want to go. 

At our meeting on 7th June, we were delighted to welcome two puppy walkers from the Guide Dogs Association. Jane, who has walked 31 puppies, brought 5 month old golden retriever Mini, and Andrea, who has walked 36 puppies, brought 7 month old labrador cross german shepherd Daisy.



Both dogs were exceptionally well behaved and Jane and Andrea talked us through the training by committed and dedicated people to transform a new puppy into a confident guide dog.

Guide dogs train around 1,450 puppies each year, and to train one puppy costs $\pm 50,000$. Not all puppies are cut out to be guide dogs and these pups are found loving homes, however some go on to work with the police, armed forces, mountain rescue etc.

The Guide Dog Association rely on donations and sponsorship to help cover the high cost involved in training a dog to assist a person with sight loss. Some people will have several dogs in their lifetime and the partnership between them is wonderful. A guide dog can be life changing for a person with sight loss, giving them confidence, independence and purpose.

<u>Des Phippen Park</u>

The recent additions to our Community Orchard have taken well so far and have already shown signs of blossom which bodes well for the future. A few of the mature trees will need to be removed at the end of the growing season as they are nearly over but will be replaced and there is a strong crop

of apples on most of the apple trees. The rewilded areas are looking good and providing plenty of natural habitat for our wildlife to thrive. This will be cut back later in the year for the winter and to prepare it for next year. Work will also be done later this year to trim back the vegetation in and around the duck pond.

On a slightly separate note, please could you kindly refrain from moving the wooden benches from the circle as these are sponsored by local residents and have been fixed into the concrete bases. Removing and relocating them will cause damage. We have opportunities to sponsor benches and picnic benches across all of our open spaces and recreational area. Elmhurst Play Area













The first phase of the park's long-awaited refurbishment commenced at the end of June, with the swings and igloo climbing frame being removed by our own handyman and councillors.

Following a short delay, the contractors moved in to install the new equipment and the surfacing, with the completion of the first phase now signed off. By the time you read this, the park will have been re-opened.

















A new wooden fence has also now been installed along the drove side of the play area, with a second gate due to be re-installed shortly for park users to utilise. Additional work will be carried out by our village volunteers to remove old fence posts and improve this area in due course.

Please note that this play area does have a Public Space Protection Order in place which means no dogs are allowed in this space.

Further updates on the timescale for the next phase will depend upon additional funding being secured through further grants and budgets. This includes the North Somerset Council match-funding scheme for play areas. Decisions are expected at the end of July and any funds received will help install

equipment for all abilities. Thanks to the support of Year 1 pupils and their families from Hutton Church of England Primary School, a new activity board is in the process of being selected by the children and will be installed in the park shortly

Village Millennium Green

In addition to the Bramley apple tree gifted to a local resident as a memo-



rial to their family, a second memorial tree has now been planted by a local resident with permission from Hutton Parish Council.

The vegetation in the former quarry at the main entrance to the Green is due to be cut-back and this space re-claimed and utilised by the local Scouting groups.

Unfortunately, we have experienced damage to some areas of the grass from the use of disposable barbecues. Please keep these off the

grass and picnic benches to avoid damaging these beautiful areas.

Public Space Protection Orders are in place and all dog walkers are kindly reminded to keep their dogs on a lead where signposted, always clear up after them and to please use the bins provided.

If anyone sees anything of interest or of concern in any of our Parish Council owned open spaces or recreation areas or if you wish to loan any of the Parish Council owned wildlife study equipment, please contact the Parish Council Office in the Village Hall.

Dabaso Clinic.

Nurse Cinderellar sent Greetings from the Dabaso clinic thanking Hutton once again for our support.

She has recently been involved in a hypertensive and diabetic screening outreach, two conditions that are prevalent and has attended a three day seminar in Kilifi organised by the World Vision and the County Government.

The training, 'Emergency Obstetrics and Neonatal Care' will help the community whilst the women of Dabaso wait for the ambulance service to arrive. People usually run to the clinic as their first port of call, and now they are better equipped to deal with an emergency situation.

Cinderellar is undertaking extra training to enable her to grow the facility further.

Cinderellar reports that the economic environment is bad for many people in the community. The prices of basic household stuffs like maize flour, cooking oil etc have skyrocketed and the fuel problems have resulted in the doubling of transport fares and closure of some companies. Local people are facing financial problems.
