Parish Clerk Retirement

Moor Lane - Cycle/Footpath Link to Haywood Village

At an on-site Meeting in April 2025 – North Somerset Council agreed to further improvements - additional barriers in Moor Lane and on the cycle/footway link to Haywood Village to prevent vehicle access. The Parish Council has been chasing an update to this work. As this edition goes to print, the Parish Council is waiting for an update from North Somerset Council.

Hutton 20MPH Speed Zone – Update

The Parish Council is aware of parishioner concerns over the enforcement of the Hutton 20 MPH Speed Zone and the Parish Council is eagerly awaiting completion by North Somerset Council of the long awaited 20 MPH Gateways (Entry Treatments) to the Hutton 20MPH Zone.

In September 2024 HPC was informed that North Somerset Council were unable to complete the 20 MPH Gateways safely, due to the fallen wall, road closure and diversion. North Somerset Council informed the Parish Council that funding for the Gateways (Entry Treatments) was on hold and they would come back to them once the diversion route is removed. Since the end of July last year and the reopening of the road and removal of the diversion, the Parish Council and our District Cllrs have been chasing the completion of the 20MPH Gateways (Entry Treatments) with North Somerset Council.

As this edition goes to print, we have been informed that North Somerset Council intend to complete the 20MPH Gateways (Entry Treatments), which involve kerb build out and associated road marking and thus complete the Hutton 20MPH speed zone by the **27th February**.

The Parish Council have been informed by North Somerset Council that:

- **Work has been programmed for the 23rd Feb for 5 days. The road will be closed at night from 7pm to midnight, with a condition for no excessive noise after 11pm.**
- **The work near Sutherland Drive will be done 23-25 Feb and the work near Vereland Road will be done on the 26-27 Feb.**
- **The road will only be closed where they are carrying out the works.**
- **Advance 'road closed' signs will go up 2 weeks prior to the closure, and a letter drop will be done for the properties directly affected.**

The North Somerset Council – **Notice of Temporary Traffic Regulation Order for the work on Old Mixon Road, Hutton and Hutton Hill, Hutton for the Temporary Prohibition of Use by Vehicles coming into force 23 Feb 2026** and a **map of the road marking** can be found later in this edition.

Once completed the Parish Council will ask for the enforcement of the Hutton 20MPH zone with Speed Checks by the Police and Hutton Community Speed Watch.

The Parish Council is also currently exploring the purchase of speed awareness signs for the Main Road.

Potential Boundary Change to the Parish of Hutton Following the North Somerset Council - Community Governance Review 2025

The Community Governance Review (CGR) [final recommendations](#) affecting the Parish of Hutton were approved by the North Somerset Council Planning and Regulatory Committee at its meeting on Wednesday 17 December.

A link to the final recommendations approved by the Planning and Regulatory Committee at its meeting on Wednesday 17 December, can be found on the Hutton Parish Council website.

A summary of the final recommendations affecting the Parish of Hutton is shown on the next page:

Parish Council News

Final Recommendation - 8.5

That Weston-super-Mare does not extend its boundary to incorporate Bleadon, Hutton and Locking (and specifically Locking Parklands).

Conclusion:

Overall, the feedback strongly supports the draft recommendation, and it is therefore recommended that the Weston-super-Mare boundary is **not extended to incorporate Bleadon, Hutton and Locking.**

Final Recommendation - 9.2

That the parish of Hutton remain unwarded.

Conclusion - It is recommended that Hutton remain **unwarded.**

Final Recommendation - 10.2

That the council size of Hutton remains 10.

Conclusion:

It is recommended that the size of Hutton parish council remain **unchanged.**

Final Recommendation - 22.2

That the Weston-super-Mare boundary is **not extended** to include a section of Hutton around Woodside which is an extension of Oldmixon

Conclusion:

Based on the overwhelming feedback from the second consultation, it is recommended that the current parish boundaries for Hutton be retained.

Therefore, as informed by North Somerset Council, all the above final recommendations affecting the Parish of Hutton were approved North Somerset Council Planning and Regulatory Committee at its meeting on Wednesday 17 December.

Hutton Parish Council once again thanks all those that responded to the CGR Consultation.

CO-OPTION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

Hutton Parish Council has **three vacancies** and the Council is proposing again to take steps to fill the vacancies by the co-option of suitable persons. Hence any eligible interested persons are invited to apply for co-option to the Parish Council as a Councillor.

Eligibility To be able to stand as a Parish Councillor, an applicant must:

- be at least 18 years old on the day of nomination
- be a British citizen, or an eligible Commonwealth citizen
- meet at least one of the following four qualifications:

1. He/she is an elector for the parish; or
2. has resided in the parish for the past twelve months or rented/tenanted land in the parish; or
3. had his/her principal place of work in the parish; or
4. has lived within three miles (straight line) of the parish.

There are certain disqualifications for election, shown below. (See section 5.80 of the Local Government Act 1972 for a full list of disqualification criteria)

- holding a paid office of the Parish Council
- bankruptcy.
- having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months, without the option of a fine during the five years preceding the election; and
- being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal practices.

Road Closure Information

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 - Section 14
 Notice of Temporary Traffic Regulation Order
 Oldmixon Road and Hutton Hill, Hutton, North Somerset
 Temporary Prohibition of Use by Vehicles Order 2026
 Date coming into force: 23/02/2026
 Ref: T26-02

Notice is hereby given that North Somerset Council in pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, intend to make an order the effect of which will be to close, temporarily, to vehicles the lengths of roads specified in the Schedules to this Notice.

Exemptions are included for emergency services, for any North Somerset Council vehicle enforcing the restrictions, any vehicle associated with the works and for any vehicle with agreed dispensation from North Somerset Council undertaking emergency work.

This order is required in the interest of public safety and to facilitate kerb build out and associated road marking. It will become operative on the **23 February 2026** for a maximum period of eighteen months. However, the restrictions may not be implemented for the whole of the period but only as necessitated, which is expected to be for **5 nights** between the hours of 19.00 hrs -23.59 hrs

Appropriate traffic signs, cones, road safety barriers and traffic diversion route signage will be displayed when the measures are in force.

Phase 1: Oldmixon Road, Hutton - from the junction of Church Lane to a point in a westerly direction along said road for 72 metres


Phase 2: Hutton Hill, Hutton - from it's junction with Canada Coombe to its junction with Vereland Road



I'm writing this whilst watching the final episode of *The Traitors* on the edge of my seat! You'll be reading this a couple of weeks into Lent, but if you are missing *The Traitors*, the baddies of Lent and Easter could offer you an alternative fix of lies and deception!

Lent begins with the Devil tempting Jesus in the desert, speaking with a smooth, convincing voice. Likewise, successful *Traitors* are often compelling storytellers who gain the trust of others, manipulating them to enhance their game.

On Palm Sunday elated crowds cheered for Jesus as he rode into Jerusalem. The crowds seemed faithful, but when the tide turned against Jesus, they condemned him and banished him. There is a herd mentality around the Round Table, with players often deceived by persuasive voices or voting to protect themselves.

Then there was the flaky player - Pontus Pilate - a cowardly traitor. He knew Jesus was innocent but didn't stick to his plan. He turned against Jesus under the pressure of the crowd's flawed, guilty, illogical preferential treatment of murderer Barabas.

Judas was the secret inside traitor, handing over Jesus, his friend, to their enemies for thirty pieces of silver. *The Traitors* shows how easily people are drawn to lying and betrayal for personal gain, whilst knowing what they are doing is wrong.

Then there was the pain of broken trust. Peter, Jesus's closest friend, deserted and betrayed him when he needed him the most. Peter was intimidated by the pressure; scared and emotionally flooded. When the truth is known, *The Traitors* players are often devastated at wrongly dismissing a faithful contestant.

In contrast to those around him Jesus was and is the ultimate faithful. Jesus overcame temptation and was never disloyal or untruthful. He put his trust in God rather than "gut feelings". Jesus was not there to win the prize. He was not afraid of being the target for traitors. His game-plan was to offer us faithful friendship.





Banwell bowling green has a long history, from its former role as the pond and paper mill to its current use. The mill closed in 1816, and reopened in 1847 before, in 1850, the site was acquired by Weston-super-Mare Waterworks and the spring was tapped for water supply.

The spring fed the millpond until the 1920s when it was drained and infilled to create the bowling green. The Bowling Club was formed in 1933. It is unique in that it is the only L shaped bowling green you will come across.



Changes over the years

Many things have changed over the years – the introduction of women into the game, the uniform, the badge and the evolution of mixed games, to name but a few!

The modern game takes numerous formats. It can be very competitive but is also great fun and very sociable.

Palmer is remembered every November.

This is his reply - "Dear Mrs. Brown, Thank you very much for your kind letter and also for the card with your good wishes of the people of Hutton and the British Legion. Mrs. Light did a good work to hand you the file, which you gave to the Somerset Archive. It was a lot of work to gather all the info but it is a pleasure to know that it is in good hands now, also thank you. Please pass my greetings to all friends in Hutton and also thanks for your work and kindness.

With warm greetings from John.

There is an addition to his letter which is very difficult to read, but explains that he is very old and that "writing is so difficult with bad eyes".

It was fascinating to read the information and research which had been gathered, so I wanted to share this information with everyone.
