It has been decided that re-usable, customized, Hutton Parish Festival Week branded pint and half pint cups <u>will be on sale during the week's events.</u>


Hutton Parish News Distribution

On the move:-

A few Sundays ago I announced to both churches that Chris and I were leaving the Benefice of Hutton and Locking in order for me to take up the post of Priest in Charge of the parish of Sawley in Derby Diocese. For those of you who like to look things up Sawley is south of Long Eaton and is in Nottinghamshire. It is a suburban

parish of 14,000 with two churches – a 13th century one and a tin tabernacle/chapel of ease. Our last Sunday here will be on 13th September which is the united service in the marque. Locking Vicarage will be let out during the interregnum. Interregnums are longer at the moment due to the troubling financial situation in the Diocese. They can be up to 2 years and maybe longer. The parish share still has to be fully paid during a vacancy. During that time services will be covered by those who currently lead and preach, along with clergy and Readers from the Deanery. I am currently working with all four churchwardens to get everything covered and in place for when we leave. It has been an adventure, a privilege and a joy to serve in both parishes. Through all the ups and downs God has been faithful to me and Jesus has always been there for me. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for all your love and support. I will also take this opportunity to encourage you to come along and be part of the wonderful church family that is St Mary's. Many of you have faith and God invites you to be part of His family – for your sake and the benefit of generations to come so the church can be here for them. Every blessing Anne.

All our hope on God is founded; All our trust he shall renew; He, our guide through changing order, Only good and only true. God unknown, He alone Calls our hearts to be His own.

There are challenging times ahead but as we send Anne and Chris to their new home, we wish them well and thank them for their ministry among us. 

Hutton/Dabaso Twinning - a round up !

Following a chance meeting with a local resident whilst holidaying in Kenya, Mark Orchard and four other builders fulfilled Mark's promise to return and build a classroom for the school, in the village of Dabaso, back in February 1999. Through this, links were established and a formal twinning between Hutton and Dabaso was formed in November 1999.





The first visit saw Hutton doctors treat hundreds of patients, horticultural society members help cultivate and sow areas for future use and supplies taken to use in the school. A water supply to the village was created and a further classroom was completed, all made possible from kind donations.

Over the years, a number of visits have been made, and the twinning has gone from strength to strength with links built with the church, Hutton primary school and the village councils.

Our twinning enables the funding of nursing staff to run the health centre, providing essential care to the villagers. Bursaries are provided for 4 children from money raised through fundraising activities in Hutton. This means children who would not otherwise be in a position to attend secondary school are able to continue their education. As one child graduates , another child is selected.





Next year marks the 25th anniversary of Hutton's friendship and collaboration with Dabaso, Kenya . Plans will begin soon in advance of a return visit .

Those who choose to visit Dabaso fund the trip themselves, meaning all money raised goes to help the people where it's needed.



Having had to cancel the Hutton Ladies event on the 4th April due to the work that took place in the village hall car park, we all reconvened on Tuesday 2nd May. Our speaker for the evening was Denise Budd who gave a talk on `*The History of the Teddy Bear*'.



Denise, who has over 100 teddy bears herself, which she has collected over many years since 2003, brought along a selection of her prized bears to our event, including many of her famous Steiff bears.

The name `teddy bear' actually came about when back in November 1902 former US President Theodore Roosevelt, (who was commonly known as "Teddy") was on a hunting trip. When the president

had no luck himself catching a bear, one of his aids caught and tied a black bear to a tree, so that the president could shoot and have his kill. As the president declined to do this, it quickly became the topic of a political cartoon in The Washington Post which was subsequently spotted by a businessman who saw the drawing and came up with a "Teddy" bear to go along with the story and the cartoon. And thus the teddy bear was born.

After our talk and by way of pre-coronation celebration, all the ladies each brought along a plateful of food so that we could round off the evening with an informal buffet.

Our next event was on Tuesday 6th June when our guest speaker, Jill Cowles, talked



on the subject of `All About Colour'. Jill helps people bring the amazing power of colour into people's lives so they can enjoy a different approach to happiness and wellbeing. She helps people tap into the coloured wavelengths of light to support and enhance physical and mental health.

WESTlink - your on-demand bus service

WESTlink is an on-demand bus service that allows users to book bus journeys through an app, website, or phone call, either when you need it or up to 24 hours before. The service is reconnecting communities by offering people without a local bus service the opportunity to get back on the bus.

WESTlink services will go where they're needed and run without a set timetable. Smaller vehicles are used so they can go to areas that are inaccessible to larger, commercial buses.


> The service runs from 7am until 7pm, Monday to Saturday. Journeys can be booked:

- through a free app download the app through the Apple App Store or Google Play by searching WESTlink.
 - by phoning the call centre 01174578561
 - on the web app, at westlink.app.ridewithvia.com

You may want to be picked up or dropped off in an area that doesn't have a physical bus stop. This could be a doctor's surgery, pharmacy, or a local shop. If there's a need for an additional bus stop, we can add new virtual stops into the service. To request a virtual bus stop, please contact us via email: westlink@westofengland-ca.gov.uk

The buses will be available for short trips or can be used to connect to the wider public transport network. Find out where you can travel to at https://iourneyplanner.travelwest.info/, or on the WESTLink App.

- A single fare for any journey length within an operating zone is £2 adults, £1 child.
 - All concessionary and older person's bus passes accepted.
- You can pay via a credit or debit card attached to your app account. You can also pay the driver with exact change.



- 1. Download the app through the Apple App Store or Google Play by searching WESTlink.
- 2. For security it will ask you to confirm your mobile phone number you will then receive a code by text that you need to input.
- 3. Set up your account by putting in your name, email address, and password.
 - 4. Add a payment card to your account to make buying tickets quicker and easier or choose to use a concessionary pass / cash.

Booking a journey

Once an account has been set up, it will recognise your current location and ask you to set a place you want to travel to. You can input an address or drag the pin. Confirm your destination. This can be any destination in your zone. You will be asked if you want to add any additional passengers travelling with you. You can either book to travel as soon as possible, or pre-book your journey for a time in the future.

Travel now


To travel now, follow the prompts on the app to enter your pick up spot and your destination. You will receive a trip proposal for when your WESTlink minibus will be with you. This will normally be between 5 and 45 minutes depending on demand and location.

If WESTlink is not able to provide a bus, you can schedule the bus for a time in the near future.

Pre-booking

You can also choose to pre-book a trip for later - up to the end of the following day. In order to pre-book a trip, begin to book your journey as if you were to book it to 'travel now'. Then, once you are offered a journey, choose the 'schedule' button in the bottom right corner of the app, in order to book a ride for the future. You can also choose whether you want to depart by, or arrive by a particular time. The arrive by function is useful for making sure you are at your destination by the time you need to be.

For pre-booked trips, you will receive an offer of a 20-minute pick up window. 30 minutes before that window you will then receive a text message with the pick-up time.



Track your vehicle

Whatever time you book, the app will show you:

- Where the bus is
- When it is coming near you
- Details of the vehicle picking you up.
- Your journey along with any other pickups and drop offs on your route
 - An estimated time of arrival
- Details of any fixed route and normal bus services in the area, in case these work better for your travel

Payment

If you pay by credit or debit card, the app will take payment when your trip starts. Just get on board when the bus arrives.

If you pay by cash or concessionary fare, you will need to pay on board with exact change or show proof of your discounted rate.

Booking via phone

You can ring the call centre to book a journey.

When you get through to an operator you'll be asked:

- name and address
- where you'd like to travel
- what time you need to arrive at your destination

Be as specific as possible with the place you would like to travel to. It helps our operators if you can provide them with an address. You will then wait for a confirmation phone call confirming what time you need to be at your chosen bus

stop.
