- 1 Exhibitors should send their entries to the Show Secretary in writing stating the class or classes in which it is intended to compete. Entry forms will be found inside this schedule.
 - Entries must reach the Show Sec. by 9 pm. on Wed 27th August 2025 at the latest.
- 2. Entries may be staged between 6pm and 10pm on Friday 29st August 2025 and 6am and 9.50am on Saturday 30th August 202
- 3. No unauthorised person will be allowed in the Show after 10.00 am until the official opening.
- **4.** The Judging will commence at 10.00 am
- 5. Judges shall not compete in any class in which they are appointed to judge and they shall not be present at the staging of the exhibits.
- **6.** Judges shall have absolute power to withhold a prize when the competing entries do not merit it.
- 7. The Committee has the power to inspect gardens of exhibitors after entries are made
- 8. All specimens have to have been the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to the show; Exhibitors must sign a declaration to this effect.

 Anyone proven by the Committee to have acted fraudulently will at once be disqualified.
- **9.** No exhibitor will be allowed to submit more than one entry in any one class.
- **10.** Unless otherwise stated in the Schedule, two or more persons may not exhibit for prizes separately from the same garden, nursery or plant house. This does not apply to any class where the plant material needs not to have been grown by the exhibitor.
- **11.** Exhibitors to provide their own stands, dishes, baskets and other requisites.
- **12.** All exhibits must remain staged until the show has been officially declared closed when exhibitors will be given permission to collect their exhibits. All exhibits not cleared thereafter will be auctioned.
- **13.** All protests or objections must be made to the Secretary in writing, accompanied by a deposit of £10, which will be forfeited to the funds if the claim is not substantiated. All protests or objections must be made before 2.30pm on the day of the Show.
- **14.** No responsibility will be accepted for any damage done to exhibits during the Show, nor will the Society be responsible for the loss of any article but all reasonable care, will of course be taken.
- **15.** All persons attending the Show do so at their own risk as the Committee cannot hold themselves responsible for any kind of accident, or for damage to, or loss to any property what so ever.
- **16.** All prize money will be ready for payment at the Show in the Secretary's tent, between 2.30 pm and 3.30pm on Saturday 30th August.
- 17. Prize money not claimed by then will be forfeited to the Society funds.
- **18.** Cups and Trophy winners will be responsible for the safe keeping of the same whilst in their possession.
- **19.** All Cups and Trophies to be returned to the Show Sec. by the end of July. Engraving to be carried out at the winner's expense.
- **20.** No unaccompanied children in the Marquee.
- **21.** All items of Handicraft to have been made by exhibitor. No kits accept if specified.
