I'm so pleased to introduce myself as the new Parish Clerk for Hutton.

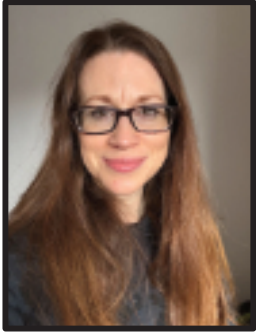
My family and I have lived in the village since 2017 and have loved becoming part of the community.

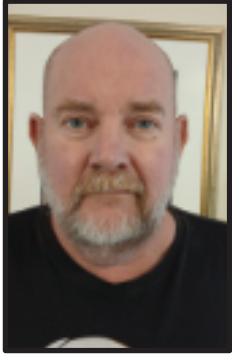

Moor Lane - Cycle/Footpath Link to Haywood Village

At an on-site Meeting in April 2025 – North Somerset Council agreed to further improvements - additional barriers in Moor Lane and on the cycle/footway link to Haywood Village to prevent vehicle access. The Parish Council has been chasing an update to this work. As this edition goes to print, the Parish Council is waiting for an update from North Somerset Council.

If Parishioners are concerned about the behaviour of motorised vehicles using or attempting to use the Moor Lane - Cycle/Footpath Link to Haywood Village, then the most efficient and quickest way to report Anti-Social Behaviour and Road and Pavement Highway issues, is to report them direct to North Somerset Council by using their **Report or Request Services online system** which can be found on their website or via a link on the Parish Council website which can be found at www.huttonsomerset.org.uk/local-information/reporting-issues. This will ensure that your report is assigned to the appropriate North Somerset Council Officer and dealt with in a timely manner. Parishioners are also requested to also inform the Parish Clerk, if they have reported any issues direct to North Somerset Council, so these issues can be monitored.

Completion of the 20MPH Gateways (Entry Treatments) and Proposed Changes to Alleviate Traffic Issues Near the School Entrance

Following the North Somerset Council completion of the 20MPH Gateways (Entry Treatments), our District Cllrs and the Parish Council are now in discussion with North Somerset Council and the School regarding proposed changes to alleviate traffic issues near the School entrance, with a meeting planned later this month.

New Dog Poo Bin in Foxglove Meadows

A new dog poo bin has now been installed on Foxglove Meadows.



New Noticeboards for Woodside and Foxglove Meadows

Two new Noticeboards have been ordered – One to replace the old one on the footpath between Woodside Avenue and Oldmixon Road and the other to be installed at the entrance to Foxglove Meadows.

CO-OPTION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL

Hutton Parish Council has **three vacancies** and the Council is proposing again to take steps to fill the vacancies by the co-option of suitable persons. Hence any eligible interested persons are invited to apply for co-option to the Parish Council as a Councillor.

Eligibility To be able to stand as a Parish Councillor, an applicant must:

be at least 18 years old on the day of nomination
be a British citizen, or an eligible Commonwealth citizen
meet at least one of the following four qualifications:


1. He/she is an elector for the parish; or
2. has resided in the parish for the past twelve months or rented/tenanted land in the parish; or
3. had his/her principal place of work in the parish; or
4. has lived within three miles (straight line) of the parish.

There are certain disqualifications for election, shown below. (See section 5.80 of the Local Government Act 1972 for a full list of disqualification criteria)

- holding a paid office of the Parish Council
- bankruptcy
- having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months, without the option of a fine during the five years preceding the election; and
- being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal practices.

Written applications or expressions of interest should be forwarded to Councillor Peter Dutton Chairman of Hutton Parish Council c/o 12 Hutton Hill, Hutton, Weston-Super-Mare BS24 9SY or via email to clerk@huttonsomerset.org.uk.

Expressions of interest can be sent on condition that a follow-up letter or email application is sent. If no follow-up letter or email application is received following an expression of interest it will be assumed that the applicant has withdrawn their interest in the position.

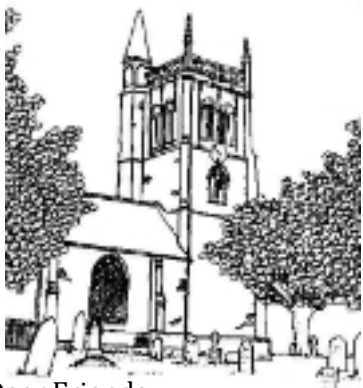

50 years of Hutton Village Hall



The green wooden hut, sat in where the car park for the hall now lives was part of an army barracks canteen used in the first world war. It was bought by the village squire, Thomas Bisdee who lived at Hutton Court so the scouts could use it, later to be passed to the Royal British Legion on condition the Scouts and Guides could still use it.

From: **We need a new hall!**

It was time after 57 years to replace the old building before it fell down! It was sold for £10!



To: **The Best in the West!**

The British Legion offered the site to the village for erection of a new hall.

The new village hall would only be built with a significant amount of money raised by the Hutton residents. Bring on the spirit of the village to organise spectacular May Day parades, a mile of pennies fundraiser on Weston seafront, buy-a-brick, raffle for a car and many other community events.

The result -The first stone was laid on 21st February 1976 and opened in October 1976. A new village hall hailed as the "Best in the West" and winning awards for the best run village hall. Run then, as it does now, by a committed team of volunteers.

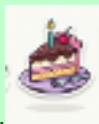

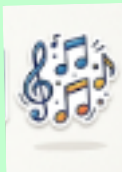

Fire Safety for Hutton Parish's most vulnerable residents

Fire can affect anyone, but some members of our community face greater risk. Families with children under five and residents aged over 65 are particularly vulnerable to the devastating consequences of fire in the home. Avon Fire & Rescue Service is now offering free Home Fire Safety Checks, with additional Home Fire Safety Visits available for people who may need extra support.

Why this matters - Working closely with communities, we're often in a position to spot when someone could benefit from extra fire safety guidance. Encouraging people to take up a free check could make a real difference — and may even save lives.

What is a Home Fire Safety Check? - A Home Fire Safety Check is a short online tool (around 15 minutes) providing personalised advice to help reduce fire risk. Some questions are optional, and the process is designed to be simple and accessible and where needed, residents may be referred for a Home Fire Safety Visit, carried out by Avon Fire & Rescue firefighters or Safe and Well officers.

How you can help – We are asking town and parish councils to signpost residents who may fall into one or more of the following groups:

- Adults aged 65 and over
- Families with children under five
- People living with dementia
- Those with long-term health conditions
- Pregnant people
- People who smoke



For residents who may be vulnerable or could benefit from extra support, please:

- Share details of the free Home Fire Safety Check
- Encourage eligible residents or carers to complete the online form
- Highlight the importance of early prevention and safety planning

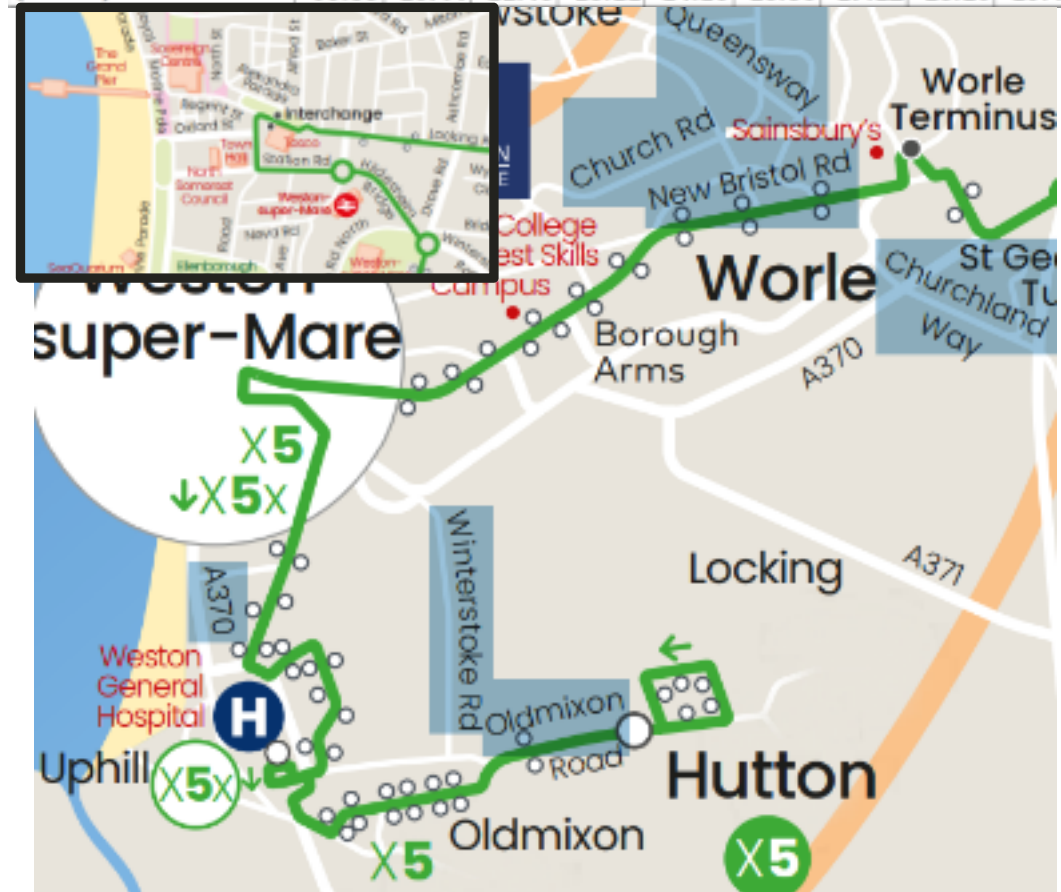
