- July - 2nd & 16th





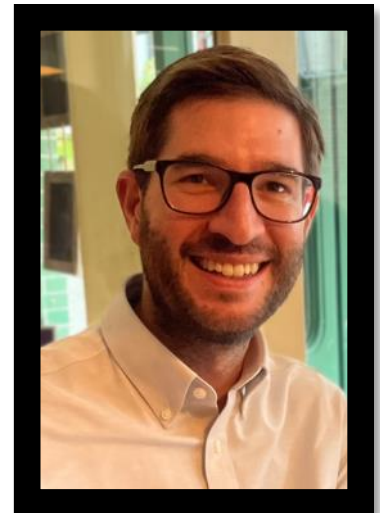

## **Hutton Hill Road Closure Update**

Following the end of the statutory consultation period and after being prioritised by North Somerset Council, with the support of our District Councillors - Mike Soloman and Terry Porter, the planning approval process for the long-awaited reconstruction of the retaining wall at 1 Barrow Road moved ahead quickly.

### **An update received from North Somerset Council on 26<sup>th</sup> March read as follows:**

“Resolving the collapsed retaining wall on Hutton Hill has involved residents, insurance companies and a number of teams from North Somerset Council working together. The collapsed retaining wall is privately owned, with sections belonging to two separate residential properties. One section of the wall has now been repaired. The repair of the remaining section of the wall is now at the stage where the resident has engaged a designer and designs have been passed to North Somerset Council’s Highways Team for technical approval. These Designs have now been approved by the highway authority. This final section has now been approved for reconstruction. Our primary concern as the Highway Authority is for the safety of road users. As soon as this section is safe to use, we will be happy to re-open the closed section of road. We understand that this closure has caused frustrations and inconvenience to local residents and we thank the community for its ongoing patience while we work hard to get a resolution.”

# Parish Council News

**An update received from North Somerset Council on 28<sup>th</sup> March read as follows:**

“We will be issuing the planning approval today, only one day after the end of the consultation period.”

**Latest update** - As this edition goes to print - **you may have noticed that work has started on the long-awaited reconstruction of the retaining wall at 1 Barrow Road.**

The first phase of the work will be the reduction of the bank, the dismantling of the remaining old wall and the rubble clearance from the road. Phase two will be the reconstruction of a new wall.



Information received by the Parish Council indicates that barring any unforeseen delays or bad weather, **the work is expected to last 8-12 weeks.** The Parish Council would like to thank our District Cllrs, North Somerset Council and the property owner of 1 Barrow Road for their continued support and updates.

# Parish Council News

## Moor Lane - Cycle/Footpath Link to Haywood Village

The long promised, planned and awaited new cycle/footpath link to Haywood Village has been built at the north end of Moor Lane. The Parish Council has expressed concerns to North Somerset Council, that with only a single bollard planned (to prevent vehicles), this will open a clear route for motorcycles and quad bikes. We are also concerned about vehicles trying to get to Haywood Village and then having to turn round and return down Moor Lane to Hutton.



We have been informed by North Somerset Council that any further barriers on the cycle/footpath (other than a single bollard, **which has been ordered by the Contractor and is planned to be installed before the end of April**) would be contrary to current guidance in respect of cycle access, which they want to encourage. However, North Somerset Council have informed us that they will keep this matter under review, and should problems arise with motorised vehicles trying to use the path, they will take appropriate action.

Hutton Parish Council have also been informed by North Somerset Council that with access maintained for landowners, pedestrians, cyclists, authorised vehicles and emergency vehicles, further improvements are being designed and planned to prevent vehicle access to the far end of Moor Lane, to protect the flood risk infrastructure, which is in place at that location.

## **Major Changes to Hutton Bus Services in April**

Changes to North Somerset's bus services - affecting Hutton came into effect from Sunday 6th April.

The 126 Wells to WSM route will no longer serve Hutton.

### **Hutton will now be serviced by the 7H.**

**7H: Weston Town Centre – Hutton** – A variation of the number 7 bus. The service will travel from Weston Town Centre via Hildesheim Bridge to Weston General Hospital, Oldmixon and **Hutton**, increasing frequency for some parts of the 7 route.

- A new service 7H will operate in tandem with the 7 and will offer an enhanced frequency of buses to Weston General Hospital and Loxton Road Campus.
- The route will operate from Weston Interchange and down Drove Road where it will pick up the current 7 route, before extending out to Hutton. **This service will run hourly from around 8am to 6pm on weekdays and Saturdays.**

The service will offer residents of **Hutton** direct links to Weston Hospital, Loxton Campus, and upon reaching Weston Interchange, some journeys will continue as service X5 onto Worle, Clevedon and Portishead. Customers may travel to these destinations directly from **Hutton** by asking for a through ticket and remaining on the bus when it arrives at Weston Interchange. Please refer to timetables and their notes to identify which 7H trips continue on to Clevedon and Portishead. Timetables for the 7H - WSM - Hutton can now be seen at the Bus Stops in **Moor Croft Road and Holm Road.**

## **CO-OPTION TO THE PARISH COUNCIL**

Hutton Parish Council still has **vacancies** and the Council is proposing again to take steps to fill the vacancies by the co-option of suitable persons. Hence any eligible interested persons are invited to apply for co-option to the Parish Council as a Councillor.

### **Eligibility**

To be able to stand as a Parish Councillor, an applicant must:

- be at least 18 years old on the day of nomination
- be a British citizen, or an eligible Commonwealth citizen
- meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
  1. He/she is an elector for the parish; or
  2. has resided in the parish for the past twelve months or rented/tenanted land in the parish; or
  3. had his/her principal place of work in the parish; or
  4. has lived within three miles (straight line) of the parish.

There are certain disqualifications for election, shown below. (See section 5.80 of the Local Government Act 1972 for a full list of disqualification criteria)

- holding a paid office of the Parish Council
- bankruptcy.
- having been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months, without the option of a fine during the five years preceding the election; and
- being disqualified under any enactment relating to corrupt or illegal practices.

# Hutton Ladies

At our February meeting we welcomed John Page, who gave us a really interesting talk on King John's Hunting Lodge, in Axbridge. The lodge is located on the corner plot of Axbridge Square. I think we were all surprised to learn that the jettied, timber-framed, three storey building was built around 1460, long after the death of King John in 1216.



Over the years the building has served as several different shops, and part of the building was also a pub called the Kings's Head, but its connection to King John isn't known for certain. The Lodge was bequeathed to the National Trust in 1971, who undertook repairs to put a halt to the deterioration of the lovely building, and it's now leased to Axbridge and District Museum. The building is really worth a visit, opening times can be found on [www.kingjohnshuntinglodge.co.uk](http://www.kingjohnshuntinglodge.co.uk) You won't be disappointed. Why not tie your visit in with a visit to the Farmers Market which is held on the first Saturday of every month in the square.

With spring fast approaching, our talk in March was very apt. Laura from Prickle Hedgehog Rescue gave us a really informative talk on the work they do to try and halt the rapid decline in numbers of our lovely hedgehogs.

**A Easter message from Rev Larissa**

Dear friends,

Now that the weather is getting a little warmer and sunnier, perhaps you are starting to enjoy your garden or the outdoors.

The Bible traces humankind's journey from garden to garden. The most famous is the first garden, Eden, where it all began....and went wrong. But in the Lenten and Easter seasons, different gardens provide the backdrop for God's promises to be fulfilled.

Jesus spent 40 days and nights in the desert wilderness, an arid garden where nothing grew, but where he was tested in preparation for the journey he was to take. Three years later Jesus' ministry took him to another garden, Gethsemane, where he was terrified because he realised that he was shortly to be put to death. He hoped to avoid this terrible death, but in Jesus' body, God chose to endure the worst sufferings experienced by humanity, so that He could look us in the eyes, come alongside us and understand us on our darkest days. Jesus' death took place in the next garden, a hideous garden, where rubbish was dumped, people tormented and which resembled hell on earth.

Jesus's body was buried in a tomb in another garden – the Easter Garden. On the first Easter morning Jesus appears to his friend Mary Magdalene there; indeed she mistakes him for a gardener, which in a way he was! Jesus is the new cultivator, the new Adam, pruning the weeds and revitalising our lives. At Easter, Jesus neutralised the world's evil, undid the alienation of Eden and reunited God and humans in a new relationship of tenderness and understanding.

Picture the Easter Garden.... Replace the figure of Mary Magdalene with a picture of yourself. Jesus offers the same love, the same tenderness, the same understanding of your life as he did to Mary Magdalene that day.



But there's an even better garden to come! The final garden is God's new creation. In the garden at the end of time we will be alongside God forever. In the fullness of time, God longs to see you in the garden of the new creation where His desire for us and our desire for God will be fulfilled. The garden will be fully unspoilt - the difficulties of being human gone. There is no trace of death in this garden, just life. Perfection in creation will be the only reality. This is eternal life.

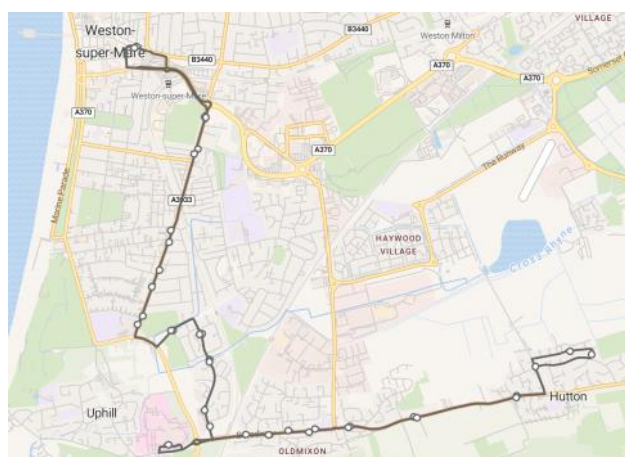

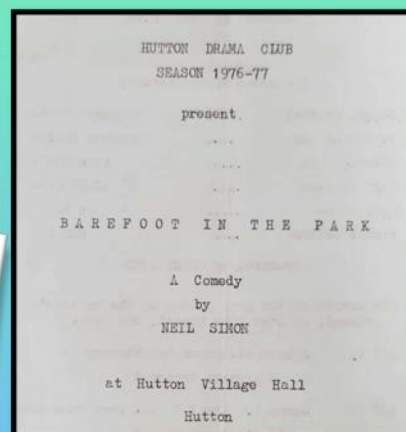
