Parish Council Vacancies

Following the standing down of the above Cllrs, the Parish Council will take steps in the near future to fill the five Parish Council vacancies.

<u>New North Somerset Council Bus Service Improvement Plan – New Demand</u> <u>Responsive Transport Service</u>

As detailed in the latest edition of the North Somerset Life Magazine – Spring 2023 Edition (Page 10) – <u>www.northsomersetlife.co.uk/issues-north-somerset-life-magazine</u> - North Somerset Council are this month launching an innovative new "Demand Responsive Transport" (DRT) service – which will run as WESTlink services.

Buses will go where they are needed and run without a set timetable. Smaller vehicles will be used.

There will be no fixed route and they will operate from the nearest bus stop, virtual bus stops and other designated points.

Buses can link to existing bus services and rail routes.

Buses can replace car travel and provide a service where buses are not available.

The new WESTlink service has been aligned to cover failing sections of current routes that have struggled to sustain timetabled services due to low passenger demand.

It will be an <u>on-demand service only and will be only available by booking</u> journeys through a free App, web site or via a telephone call centre. <u>The WESTlink service will only run when booked.</u>

The areas covered by the new **WESTlink on-demand service** will be adjusted over time to cater for demand, but the initial areas are planned to include **Hutton**.

At the time of writing - Hutton Parish Council has requested and is awaiting promotional materials from North Somerset Council for the Parish Council Website, Facebook page and for our Notice Boards and for future editions of the Hutton Parish News. Please watch out for these when they become available and please also look out for any the WESTlink promotional material appearing on any of our current bus stops.

Fraud is an ever-evolving crime and fraudsters are constantly finding new ways to target victims, especially the most vulnerable in our community. Did you know that $\pounds190$ billion is lost to fraud each year and that fraud accounts for 41% of all reported crime, although roughly 20% of all fraud is never actually reported.

With that in mind, Hutton Ladies were therefore delighted to welcome Megan Haldane and Jordan Coates from Avon & Somerset Police to Hutton Ladies on the evening of Tuesday 7th February. Megan, Cyber Protection Officer (left) and Jordan, Fraud Protect (right) gave us a very informative and honest conversation about fraud and cyber-crime with the aim of breaking down the stigma associated with it. We have all no doubt experienced some sort of scam attempt at some point in our lives, so it was interesting to have some clarification on some of the cybercrime myths.

Jenny's topic was Genetic Genealogy and how it can enhance your family history. Did you know that by using a DNA testing company of your choice, and by simply supplying them with a cheek swab or phial of saliva, you will be provided with information that will help you to discover more about your ethnicity and ancestry – and even find out what percentage Scottish, Swedish or English etc you might be! It is a very interesting way of finding other people who have similar DNA to yourself, who could then be added to your family tree and also, in some cases, possibly be a way of finding people who are potentially `lost' family members.



And finally, a small group of Hutton Ladies had a day out on the 22nd March to Oakham Treasures, just off the M5 at Portbury. For those of you have not ever visited Oakham, it offers an award winning collection of unique memorabilia from the last century and earlier. It was

Hutton Village Hall Help (Y)our Hall

Over the last year or so, our monthly utility costs have gone from roughly £600 to £2500. The hall turned off the gas heating and now runs on electric heaters, which is currently seeing a saving of around £700 monthly.

You may have heard that there is a serious water leak under the hall carpark. We are getting some help from some great local guys to replace our water supply pipes - following a costly leak from the elderly steel pipes - saving us many, many thousands of pounds. Without such help we may well have become bankrupt.

Hutton Village Hall has been serving this community since 1976. We all, at some point will want or need to use the hall.

Meeting this level of costs with our current income is not sustainable. Our income comes from groups using the halls regularly, and at weekends, and from events/ parties

We do not have the income to pay for a caretaker, bookings officer, cleaner or facilitator. Some amazing work is being undertaken by volunteers but more help is needed to bring the hall up to a better 'more rentable' standard. We must become more commercial to be sustainable and as a result hire charges are currently being increased.

Can you help by making a donation to help with minor repairs or decorating costs? If you have handyman skills or a trade, perhaps you could donate some time? We need all sorts of skill sets - Events organisers, Administrators. But most of all we need you, our Community, to support the hall.

Des Phippen Park

A working party took place on 11th February with work undertaken to prune the trees across the orchard and replant several trees. This will help preserve the life of existing trees and encourage future crops of apples. Our thanks go to the parishioners and councillors who kindly gave up their time to assist.



Unfortunately, we were not successful this year for the Thatchers Community Orchard campaign, having already been gifted ten trees in 2022. The Parish Council will replace any trees as and when required throughout the year from its existing budget. If any one does have any unwanted apple trees, we would always welcome these and find them a new home within the parish.

With the weather now slowly starting to improve following the extended wet and cold period, the re-wilding areas that were cut-back last year will now begin to grow, with further wildflower seeds sown to encourage and continue attracting the vital bees and insects to this wonderful space.





Elmhurst Play Area

Following the successful completion of phase two of the play area's refurbishment project, we now await completion of some minor maintenance to one of the spring rockers. A decision on our National Lottery Community Fund application is expected at the end of April and we hope to deliver more good news in our next addition. This will be used to complete the third and final phase to replace the last two old items of play equipment.

The two activity panels have been delivered and will be installed shortly within the park. Due to a

number of challenges faced this month, we aim to complete this by late April or early May now. Once again, our thanks go to the last year's Year One pupils, staff, friends and family from Hutton Primary School who raised funds from a reading challenge, to help towards the costs. The two panels selected are a sliding-tile frog puzzle and a flip-over noughts and crosses' game.



Following close dialogue with North Somerset Council, work has also been completed by its contractor to lay tarmac along sections of the footpath between Main Road and Elmhurst Road.



Public Space Protection Orders are in place and all dog walkers are kindly reminded to keep their dogs on a lead where signposted, always clear up after them and to please use the bins provided.

The Fairtrade Foundation

encourages community groups, churches and other organisations to mount a "Big Brew" during Fair Trade Fortnight, the purpose being to highlight the need for the growers and producers, mainly in poor countries, to receive a fair price for their produce eg:- coffee, tea, cocoa, bananas, dried fruit, cotton, soap etc.

The Fairtrade Foundation negotiates fair market prices to benefit those growers, mainly small family cooperatives, to provide enough income for families to eat, send their children to school (reducing child labour and abuse), and access medical facilities. These cooperatives also receive a pre-

mium, which enables them to choose how the money is spent to the benefit of all. Fairtrade products can easily be identified in the shops and supermarkets by the Fairtrade label - shown here!

On the 8th March, we hosted our "Big Brew" in the Village Hall, on our regular morning, courtesy of our support team, Jenny, Suzanne, Ginny, Lyn, Sue, Pete, Nigel and John.



This year, we were delighted to welcome Little Owls Play School, Reception and Year 6 from Hutton CE Primary School, to sing and highlight the Fairtrade message. Little Owls and Reception sang two songs, 'The Banana Boat Song' and 'Pick a Bale of Cotton'.
